Hi Fred -

We would be interested in the thesis as it was completed for your undergraduate degree. If the journal article has a DOI, we can include that in the thesis record, and it will appear as a link out to the published version with text indicating that users should cite *that* version rather than the one found in DukeSpace.

You might want to confirm with the publisher of the journal that including your thesis in DukeSpace (an open-access repository) doesn't clash with any publication agreement you made with them. That sort of practice is becoming less common in the publishing world, but still happens from time to time. If that is an issue, you can either choose not to submit your thesis, or we can embargo it for a period of time (two year initial embargo, with the option to extend by an additional three years).
