Correction: Identifying Factors Associated with Head Impact Kinematics and Brain Strain in High School American Football via Instrumented Mouthguards

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This erratum is to correct the mean and standard deviation values of MPS95 in the first paragraph of the Results section and the Abstract. The mean \pm SD values for MPS95 should be stated as 0.145 ± 0.119 .

Further, the caption for Fig. 5 should state that the brain simulations are showing maximum principal strain, not 95% maximum principal strain. All data and images from figures including values of MPS95 are accurate as originally presented.

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
